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The letters of recommendation are considered serious considerations for admission agents. Considering that college admissions get increasingly competitive each year, recommendations can do a lot to help you accept (or, in Gulp, rejected). Admission committees want to know more about you. They want to have a strong sense of who you are in terms of your personal strengths, personality and interests. What motivates you? How do you communicate with your teachers and colleagues? How do you respond to challenges? What goals have you set for yourself and what are you doing to work for them? If this information sounds quite personal, this is because it is. That's why you need to ask someone to advise you who knows you well and can write a warm and persistent letter. "You should not be afraid to tell your advice what would have entered your ideal letter. Do you want your English teacher to talk about your ability to write and passion for poetry? Do you want your biology teacher to focus on your curiosity of the natural world? Let your advice know what matters most to you. It will help you write his letter, and will help you get a great reference to send to your colleges. Your school counselor can be in a particularly good position to comment on what you bring to the school community and how you grew up in your high school time (regardless of a four-year transformation). If there was a significant turning point, revelation or challenge that hit you in recent years, you should share it with the school counselor. When they talk about your growth ability, it also helps to communicate to admission agents a vision of what you will accomplish in college and beyond. Some skills and qualities that affect the admission officer include the strength of the character, the leadership demonstrated and creativity. Your counselors could talk about your honesty, integrity, courage, humor, thought, maturity, cultural awareness, understanding, or compassion for others. Your teachers may be able to discuss your capabilities of problem solving, analysis, foreign language, communication or collaboration. Your letter is stronger if it comes from someone who knows you well and highlights your personal strengths. A personal letter shows that you have established good relationships with your teachers and will do the same in a university campus. Key point Your recommendation letter should help admission officers to meet you as a multidimensional person, even if they have never met you. It should talk to your personal qualities, as well as your academic capacity. To get a personal recommendation letter, you should do two things. First ask who knows you well. Secondly, tell your recommender what you want you to include in your letter and what values, goals and experiences are more important to you. Just how to support the SAT or ACT essay with examples, the recommendation letter should give specific examples. Your adviser should describe an observation or an interaction that he had with you who illustrates something essential on your character. Let's take a look at what I mean when I say your letter of recommendation can "show" and not just "tell". Another reason why it is a good idea to ask a counselor who knows you well is that it will be able to give anecdotes and specific examples. If your letter is full of abstract statements, then it doesn't do much to paint a picture of you in the reader's mind. Your counselor should illustrate your strong points with significant stories. Consider these two examples: 1. Jen cares about other people. She is kind and compassionate. She is also a talented artist. Jen is taking care of nature and artistic talent I am what makes Jen special. 2. Jen combined two of her stronger heritage of her - the artistic talent of her and the deep empathy for others-to organize a cafeteria style benefit. You have coordinated with students and teachers to hold a night of student work and performance and collect money for a local homeless refuge. You also contacted the companies of the community to give food and equipment for the event. The intimate and stimulating event was a great success, and, thanks to the vision and leadership of Jen, will be held back in the spring semester. Both examples try to communicate the same personal qualities of Jen: the artistic inclination of her and care of her for others. But the first does not give examples, and the reader doesn't know how Counselor knows this about Jenny or the extent to which it is true. Could you take care of others, but did you motivate you to act somehow that benefits from those around you? The second example is specific, tells a story, and explains how the values and interests of Jen Jenin concrete action. In addition, it differentiates it from other students with a memorable and impressive history of its coffee advantage. Don't worry if you're reading this and think: "But I never created a charity café at my school." This is just an example. Even a small moment can take on a great significance and communicate something essential on your values and character. As I mentioned earlier, if you can think of any specific experience or challenges that were significant or taught you something about yourself, you should talk about them with your recommender. If your advisor knows you well, then he should also have specific examples that he can incorporate into his letter. Key point Your letter should use meaningful and vivid stories and examples to demonstrate your exceptional qualities. If you have any ideas, share them with your advisor. Your advisor may also include his stories that reveal who you are and what kind of person admission agents can expect to show up at their college. You can have a lot of input and control on what goes in your letter. At the same time, it is up to your advisor to make sure his letter is well written and error free. A large letter of recommendation should be clear and articulated. Your letter should use the powerful language As with any writing piece, the choice of the word in your college letter is very important. We hope that your recommender writes a letter that is focused, clear, and use strong and precise adjectives. Rather than calling you smart, your advisor might talk about your innovative approach to solving problems. Rather than calling you a hard worker, he might say you're diligent and resourceful. Other strong words intuitive, analytical, curious, observant, mastery of a specific thematic, creative, mature, flexible, generous, empathic, leader, versatile, ethical, motivated, ambitious and communicative area. Generic words or clichés would weaken your letter, as a "hard worker" who "goes above and beyond" and "always shoots for the stars". Your letter should not also be characterized by superior enthusiasm, with words and phrases like "genius" or "superstar" with "too amazing to believe" results. Similarly, your letter should not have ambiguous words or phrases that could be confused or interpreted in a unflammmable way. If he says you're "independent," this might sound a little harsh, like I don't always work well with others. If your advisor says "explain for example," it may, intentionally or not, suggest a lack of leadership positions in the school. Finally, if your advisor focuses on your "extraordinary potential" and "cultivating room", an admission officer may read between the lines that your advisor is not too impressed by your progress so far. While these phrases are not a red flag for themselves, they should be balanced with other strengths and positive comments. Sometimes your advisors will show you their letters before sending them, so you can look over them and kindly offer any suggestions for review. Other times, your councilman will keep the letter confidential. In this case, the best thing you can do is ask a teacher who has a reputation to write well and put the effort in his letters. If you feel someone use a form letter for everyone and just connect the students names, then avoid the person at all costs! In practice, English teachers are often banged with recommendation letter requests in the fall of the senior year, because they are generally good writers. If you would benefit from a letter from your English teacher, make suresoon and talk to her about your ideas for your letter. Conversely, if your recommender says they are "Above the average" or "satisfying", it seems warm and will not add much to your application. For a high school, a mediocre ranking as this could even sink your application to the bottom of the batteries. Finally, your letter of recommendation should come from a qualified person whose opinion of official admissions will take seriously. Schools have requirements for those who should be your recommendation letters. You should also know who to ask and those who don't ask. Your letter should come from the right person I mentioned a few times that your recommendation letters should come from teachers or consultants who know the student well. Readers can resume so easily, from the deep intuition depth and how your letter is customized. They should also come from the right people. For example, more selective schools require two teacher recommendations and a recommendation of a school consultant. Other schools only want a REC teacher and a REC consultant. First, ask a teacher who supports you and knows you well. Secondly, don't be afraid to give them information, both in the form of a "brag sheet" full of your self-reflections and explicitly saying what you want your letter to include. This is particularly effective if you are applying to an important specific, such as English, and wants your English teacher to talk about your in-depth analysis of literature. As long as you are thoughtful about those who ask and give a serious thought about what you want your ideal letter to include, then your efforts should pay with an impressive and memorable letter of recommendation for your college application.
